KS3	Job Awareness What Are My Choices for KS4?	Students to learn about industry sectors, growth sectors and interesting jobs for the future during drop down PSHCE sessions.	Drop down lesson where students explore opportunities for work in the future. Discussions from staff about job experiences. Students' PLA's and staff talk about career interests and try to find out about possible career choices. Staff encourage curiosity and offer advice to get students to look into.	1-2-1 guidance is available to discuss Sixth Form, Further Education, Apprenticeships and Post 16 and 18 options.
10	Exploring Possibilities Getting ready for Y11? Job opportunities!	Students research job opportunities and career paths. Learning how to match themselves to job ideas and how to write CV's / cover letters.	Students' meet careers guidance staff through the year. Students have support as a group & 1-1 discussions regarding possible career paths. Students complete and develop CV's as part of their IT and English work. As a class they develop how to write a letter during their English lessons. They look at their skills and how they could market themselves to employers.	
11	What will I do after Y11? What next?	Students will create an action plan for their Post 16 journey through meetings with the careers advisor and staff in the academy.	Mentors and PLA discuss career pathways and ideas regularly. Conversations are had during form time and social times as well as structured time with careers advisor and mentors. Students are supported fully to work towards applying for colleges, training or apprenticeships, attending interviews, following up letters and placements through to starting at college after the summer. They will have access to a full range of independent, impartial careers and education options.
